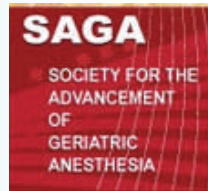

## INTENT AND OVERVIEW

It is established that the outcome of patients undergoing major orthopedic surgery depends upon anesthesia and postoperative pain techniques. With the support of Orthopedic Anesthesia, Pain and Rehabilitation Society and The Society for the Advancement of Geriatric Anesthesia. This conference has been planned to provide education to increase the ability of anesthesiologists and other interested health care professional to perform and/or understand anesthesia and acute postoperative techniques in order to optimize immediate recovery of patients undergoing orthopedic procedures. The 7th Annual preASA Meeting is intended to focus on orthopedic trauma as it relates, to the battle field and disaster relief; the elderly orthopedic patient and report on the OAPRS task force on anticoagulation and regional anesthesia.
